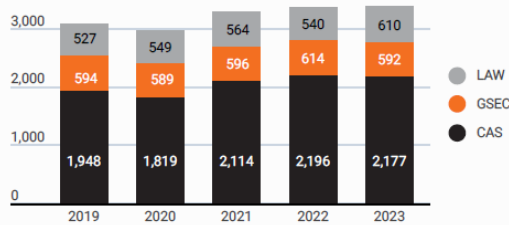


## Student Enrollment- Snapshot & Trends

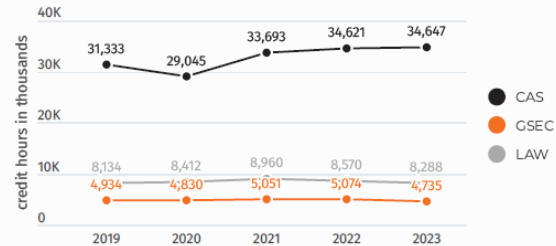
As of October 1, 2023 Census

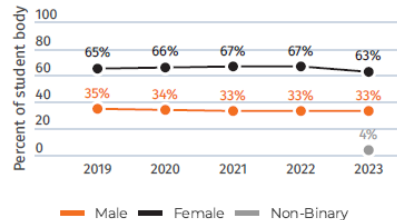
### Gender Identity

### Gender - 5 year trend\*



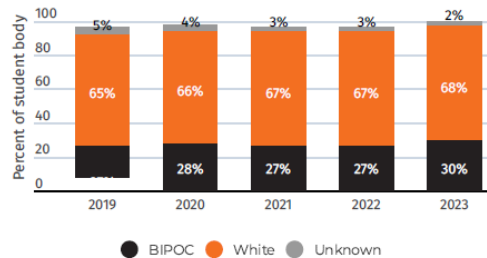

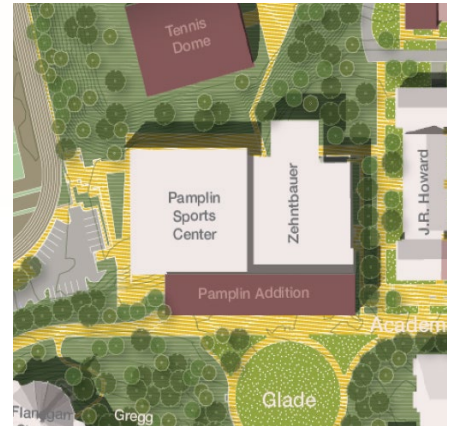

# Parking and Transportation Management

## •Parking Management and Enforcement

- Daily rates: \$5.50/day (7am to 7 pm), \$3.50/day (3 pm to 7 pm)
- Off-site parking management (warnings, citations)
- Required vehicle registration and permit enforcement
- First-year student vehicle prohibition

## •Financial Subsidies

- 75% TriMet subsidy for students, staff, faculty and contractors

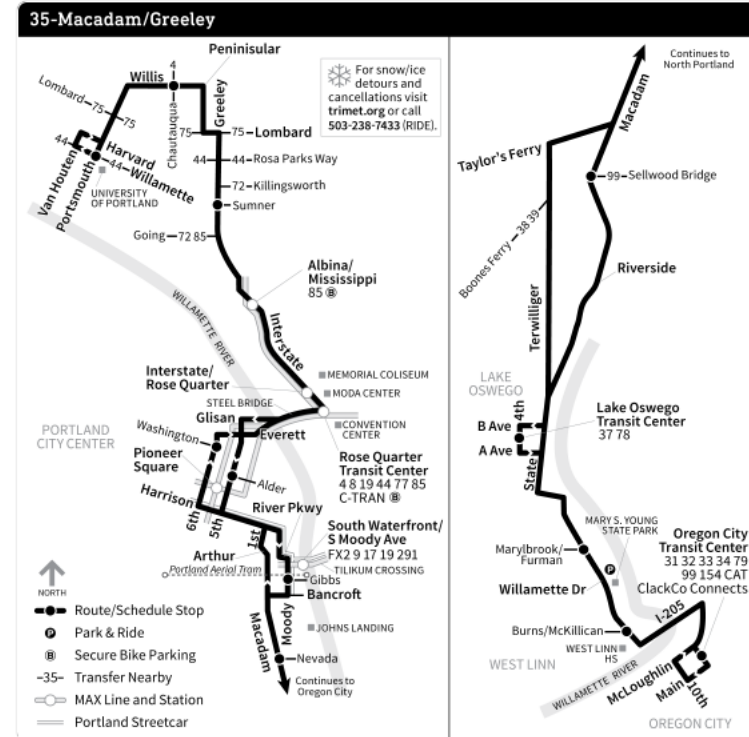
# Tri-Met Service to Palatine Hill

## 35-Macadam/Greeley

Effective August 27, 2023

We've improved Line 35 service, with buses arriving every 30 minutes for more hours of the day, every day. We also changed the route with buses between Johns Landing and Lake Oswego alternating between Highway 43/Riverside (35R Macadam/Riverside) and Taylors Ferry and Terwilliger Blvd (35T Macadam/Terwilliger) to serve Lewis & Clark College and South Burlingame.

**Parking**  
Members of the Lewis & Clark community—students, faculty, staff and vendors—are not permitted to park on neighborhood streets while engaged in Lewis & Clark activities or business. Lewis & Clark enforces this requirement by requiring that members of the campus community register their vehicles with the Parking and Transportation Office. Registered vehicles that are improperly parked in the neighborhood are subject to being fined by the College, and such

The **Student Code of Conduct**, which applies to all undergraduate students, states that the College has jurisdiction to adjudicate alleged conduct violations regardless of whether they take place on- or off-campus. If the College receives information about a student or students violating policies in a manner that disrupts our neighbors, including those bordering the College, the College will work to hold those students accountable for violations of our student conduct expectations to the same degree, and in the same manner, as if the conduct had occurred on-campus.

Unlawful behavior, public intoxication and/or drug use, disorderly conduct, loud music, and/or noise that violates Portland noise ordinances are examples of behaviors that may be disruptive to neighbors, and that may be enforced through the student conduct process.

Neighbors with concerns about student conduct impacting their neighborhood can report their concerns using this **online reporting form**, with as much information as possible. Reports can be filed anonymously, although our ability to respond to you will be limited if the concern is anonymous. In addition, our ability to provide information regarding the resolution of a complaint may be limited by applicable federal student privacy laws.
